LARRY DOBY STATUE

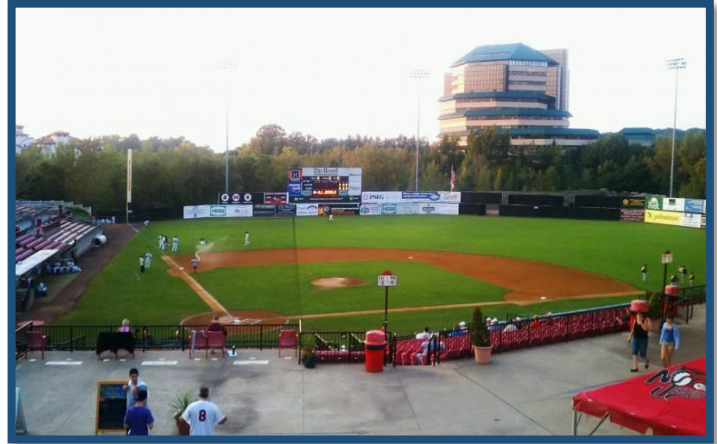
150 McLean Boulevard, Paterson, NJ 07504

Unveiled in 2002, a bronze sculpture of Larry Doby was designed by Phil Sgobba. The sculpture stands tall at Larry Doby Field in Paterson, New Jersey. Larry was the First African-American player in the American League and also the first to hit a home run in the World Series.

LOU COSTELLO MEMORIAL

"Lou's On First," a life-size bronze of comedy genius Lou Costello carries a bat and wears his trademark derby. The statue is in front of a gazebo in Federici Park. The statue is holding a baseball bat in reference to his signature "Who's on First?" skit that he performed with Bud Abbott.

Exhibits detail Paterson's role as the nation's first planned industrial city. Photograph collection of 200,000 negatives and prints, locomotives, rock and mineral specimens, art exhibits, the first practical submarine, Colt Firearms, and samples from the silk industry. Paterson is remembered in United States history as "Silk City."

YOGI BERRA MUSEUM

The idea for creating the independent, nonprofit institution germinated after Montclair State University awarded Mr. Berra, a longtime resident of Montclair, NJ, an honorary doctorate degree in 1996. Shortly thereafter, a minor-league ballpark on campus was named after him. Later, a group headed by MSU board trustee Rose Cali began plans for a museum adjacent to the stadium, which would tell Mr. Berra's inspirational story and serve as an educational model.
